Parish Council News, July 2018

Chairperson's Report 2017/2018

During 2017/2018 sadly Bill Consterdine stepped down as a Councillor for the second time after so many years' service to the community that we have lost count. We wish him well in his second retirement. However, we have been delighted to welcome several newcomers to the Parish Council as Tim Lawton, Suzie Warren and Lynette Hopkins were co-opted as Councillors.

Our Clerk, Kirstin Dixon, resigned after five years in the post to do a post-graduate course and was succeeded by Sandie McBennett, who had to leave for family reasons. We thank them for their contribution to the work of the Council. Bee Lopez Bloor became Clerk in April and is proving to be a great support to Councillors.

Long-serving past Councillors were recognised through the street names on the Anwyl development when Councillors' recommendations for (Charles) Marshall Drive, (Derek) McKelvey Way, and also Rope Walk, were accepted by Cheshire East Council.

Despite ongoing disappointment at the outcome of objections to planning permission, the Parish Council has been party to the refusal of the Moorsfield/Tollgate and Woore Road/Mount Pleasant application and (after quite a fight) been successful in getting a right turn lane into the new Anwyl development when coming from Nantwich. Councillors will be working with Cheshire East on the next stage of the Neighbourhood Plan once their requirements for Audlem are fully known.

The Parish Council gave a second £10,000 donation to the new Annexe, which is doing well after its grand opening in November. The Council has also supported the Music and Arts Festival, Carnival and ADAS. The well-attended village meeting in April 2017 had a rural theme, focusing on the countryside and wildlife surrounding Audlem and ways of accessing it.

This coming financial year promises to be particularly exciting as, with the full support of residents, the Parish Council will purchase the Green Lane field. This will protect this special area from development and ensure it is kept for community use. If planning permission can be obtained and the necessary funding found it is hoped that additional parking spaces can be made available to

provide some relief to the parking problems in the village.

The ongoing saga of the take-over of the playing field complex remains unresolved due to staff issues in Fields in Trust and a number of legal issues but we are hopeful that the transfer will soon be completed.

After four years in the role, this is my last report as Chair of Audlem Parish Council and I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow Councillors for their support and, in particular my Vice Chair, Geoff Seddon, for his hard work throughout this time. At the May AGM Geoff was elected Chair with David Higham as Vice Chair and I wish them every success in their roles.

Several water butts have been installed to minimise the use of water and some of the older tubs have been replaced.

The most recent ADAS fundraising event was the Open Gardens weekend in June. The event was a great success, due in part to the wonderful weather. Approximately 400 visitors enjoyed looking around the variety of gardens on display. Many had come from far afield - Sandbach, Newcastle, Stoke, Yeovil, Oxford and "somewhere in Suffolk"! A grand total of approximately £1,800 was raised, which will be used to fund future projects in Audlem. Many thanks are due to the garden owners for all their hard work, especially those who provided the much appreciated refreshments for visitors.



The children at St James School will soon be receiving plants to grow during the summer holidays. This year the School Council has voted to have pumpkins - they will be judged in September according to size and the most creative carving/dressing - again the choice of the School Council. It will be interesting to see the results of their hard work!

The next ADAS event will be a choral concert in St James Church on Saturday 20th October at 7pm. Audlem Voices and Weaver Primary School Choir will be performing - it should be an entertaining evening.

Maughan Lass, the Overwater Wheelyboat, can report an almost 50% increase in sailings and passengers this



season. This has been helped by more joint bookings with the Audlem Lass. This enables people of limited mobility to enjoy our very attractive canal with others who are more mobile. People can enjoy the bird life and serenity and, of course, the excellent Bridge 80 cafe. The weather has helped enormously this year.

The service is very flexible and availability can be established with a call to 01270 812677 or 01270 811454. The cost of the wheelyboat is simply a donation depending on numbers and ability to pay.

Normal sailings are Monday to Friday at 11am and 2pm, but we are flexible and can adjust timings (for example to suit cafe reservations).

Events at Audlem Mill

Now in its tenth year, the July Gathering of Historic Boats is one of the major events on the canal system each year. Organised by Audlem Mill, it attracts about 30 to 35 old ex-working boats to the canal locks. The boats were built between the 1890s and about 1960, many having travelled up to a week or more to get here, and present a wonderful colourful spectacle. Visitors come from all across the Midlands and North.
